MEET THE VILLAGERS OF MTO WA MBU

We support the local community by buying fruits and vegetables at the local market in Mto wa Mbu. Join us and we will show you around on the local market. It's also the place in case you want to buy local souvenirs. We will make sure you don't pay too much by negotiating for you. The tour starts in the village. Costs: \$30,= p.p.

LOCAL TRANSPORT

Of course your own driver can drive you comfortably to the village. You can opt for a bajaj (tuk-tuk) or, even more adventurous, a pikipiki (on the back of a motorcycle). A local (English speaking) guide will accompany you. They know their way around Mto Wa Mbu like no other. For a bajaj you pay 6 USD additional per bajaj (maximum 2 persons). For a pikipiki you pay 4 USD per person.

Note: participation in one of the activities is at your own risk.
